

Understanding the Scriptures

"He first found his own brother Simon and told him, 'We have found the Messiah.'" After spending the day in the company of Christ, Andrew took action. He shared the good news! Instead of keeping his newfound friendship with Jesus all to himself, Andrew invited his brother into the fold. Andrew found Simon and "brought him to Jesus." This was no small matter because Simon would become Peter, the first pope! How important it is to bring others along with us to meet Christ!

Yet, how often do we reach out with the kind of confidence that Andrew had? Are we ready and willing to share our faith with our family and friends? Do we consider our relationship with Jesus a gift to be shared, or a fact to be safely hidden away in our personal prayer corner?

Part of our call as Christians is to evangelize others, to share with them the good news of salvation. Loving Jesus and following his moral commands is essential, of course, but it is not the end of the story. The Gospel message is meant for all people, and we are meant to be its messengers. Sometimes this requires us to step out of our comfort zone. It may mean speaking up when we'd rather be silent. It may mean inviting someone to Mass when they might say no. But it might also mean a conversion for someone we care about. It might mean a new minister for the Church. Ultimately, it might mean another saint in heaven.

None of that is up to us, however. What we can control is only whether we share our faith joyfully and extend the invitation to others to experience the peace that comes from knowing Christ.

WELCOME IHOC GUESTS!


On Sunday January 14th St. Mary will welcome eight – perhaps more by then, given the very cold weather of late – homeless men in transition from substance abuse dependency to lives of independence and self-sufficiency. The men are this year's participants in the IHOC Network program, the Interfaith Homeless Outreach Council's primary ministry housing men at several Camden County religious congregations from November to mid-May. The men will be coming to St. Mary's from Oaklyn Baptist Church, and will move to Grace Episcopal Church in Haddonfield following their two-week stay with us. We are very grateful to the many parishioners of St. Mary's, with help from Christ Our Light parish, who "make it work". If you are not already involved in a particular aspect of the program, please consider at least visiting with the men during their stay with us: evenings and weekends – and there will be a large screen TV for watching those Eagles playoff victories!

"If IHOC could sum up its philosophy in a few words or with a short phrase it would be "quality over quantity." We aim not just to temporarily alleviate the suffering of a large segment of the homeless but rather to change their lives and get them off the streets for good. It is difficult, if not impossible, for impersonal and over-stretched bureaucracies to make the kind substantial impact on a person's life that our organization regularly does each and every year through a more caring, attentive, and hands-on approach.

Today IHOC is made up of over forty congregations from many faiths and cultures. Since its inception two decades ago, IHOC has made an incredible impact on the lives of countless homeless individuals and dramatically increased the scope of its activities. We have continued to refine and adopt our practices over the years to improve our efforts towards helping those homeless individuals we take into our programs." *(Taken from www.interfaithhomelessoutreachcouncilsj.org)*

PARISH INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism: Celebrated any Sunday of the month at the 11:30am Mass during the Easter Season, and on the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm all year round. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

Visitation & Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

Marriage: Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date.

Funerals: The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation.
