

To all of the good people and friends of Saint Mary, Cherry Hill,

As you may have heard, a major campaign is underway at Saint Mary. *Catholic Strong*, the Campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey, is seeking to secure a minimum of \$50 million, which will primarily benefit our local parishes. Seventy percent of the funds raised through this effort (a total of \$35 million) will be allocated for parish needs and thirty percent (a total of \$15 million) will fund the diocese's coordination and support of various ministries. The mission of this campaign is to ensure that our parishes are financially stable and allow the diocese the opportunity to address long-term and extraordinary needs so that our Church will have the strength and stability to serve future generations of Catholics.

70% of the campaign funds that we raise toward our parish goal will be used for the following parish needs:

### **Capital Improvement Projects with Estimates** \$495,000

- Replace church HVAC/air conditioning system and replace Parish Hall HVAC/air conditioning system (\$200K)
- Renovate parish hall kitchen/replace side doors in Hall (\$75K)
- Remove church pews, replace carpeting with tile and reupholster pews (\$140K)
- Replace rectory roof (\$15K)

#### **Evangelization and Ministry with Estimates**

#### \$65,000

• Hire a full-time youth minister and provide funding for two years of salary and benefits (\$65K)

The remaining funds will be allocated for Catholic education, social service outreach, and evangelization and faith formation efforts across South Jersey.

In the coming weeks, we will share further details about the campaign with all of you. It is my hope that our entire community will join together and participate in this extraordinary effort for our parish. Thank you for your continued prayers and support!

## Recognizing God in Your Ordinary Moments

I use GPS wherever I go and it serves me well most of the time. However, sometimes it leads me to a place that does not exist. Then there are those times when I am about to turn and the man inside my phone shouts out, "GPS signal lost" or "Rerouting!" The problem is when the area is unfamiliar to me, I have no choice but to listen. I could try to get where I am going by simple intuition or pulling over to look at a paper map, but I don't trust my sense of direction and haven't bought a paper map in close to a decade.

They find themselves constantly rerouting and wondering when they will ever get to a satisfying final destination. What they need is a compass and a companion for the journey, yet they have no idea how to get either.

Prayer can serve as a compass and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the divine we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination.

God, through prayer, will help us see all we have as gift. God, through prayer, will lead us away from materialism and selfishness toward freedom and generosity.


