

#### OOPS! PLEASE HOLD YOUR APPLAUSE!!!

Dear Parishioners.

Throughout the history of the church, within the liturgy, the ministry of music is one of the most ancient ministries and holds a very special place. Why? Because it is an integral part of the very prayer of the Mass. The music we hear, perform and sing at Mass is not at all the same as we hear performed at a concert or other venue, even if occasionally a religious song is sung in concert.

Why? Because Music at Mass is <u>part of the Mass itself.</u> It is **prayer**, not merely performance. It has as its goal to engage our very hearts and souls for the very purpose of enabling us to enter **more deeply** into the prayer being offered. Performance music (as in concerts) is an end unto itself. It seeks to have us listen, bob our heads, tap our feet, and yes enjoy it, but it ends there. Music at Mass, is meant to foster our encounter with the living God: to lift our hearts - not to just give us a good feeling, but to enable us to lift all that is in our hearts to God in **prayer**; whether in sorrow or joy, praise or petition, - everything that comes from the core of our being.

Music has the power to move hearts, to lift hearts, to give voice to the depths of our soul. <u>It is that power</u> we tap in order to <u>put it at the service of the Holy Spirit</u>, when we gather to serve as music ministers, and as an assembly at prayer.

In recent years, some Catholics, have lost this understanding. (We even saw that at the Philadelphia Papal Mass where, despite requests beforehand to the contrary, "habit" won out). We tend to speak/think of having music at Mass, when what we actually doing, is singing the Mass, itself. We sing the actual parts of the Mass: The Entrance Antiphon (Gathering Song), perhaps the Lord have Mercy, the Glory to God, the Responsorial Psalm, the Gospel Alleluia, the Offertory Chant (Offertory/Preparation of the Gifts Song), the Holy, Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Great Amen, occasionally the Lord's Prayer, the Lamb of God, the Communion Antiphon (Song)..... prayers of the actual Mass itself!

We would not consider applicating someone who is praying those prayers without music, yet curiously, a few local parishes have picked up the habit of applicating the music ministers at the end of Mass. Over the summer, at some of our Masses we, unfortunately, did too.

Linda and Jim, and all of our music ministers, understand and truly appreciate that this is intended as a show of support and appreciation to them. And they are very grateful. However, they, as all music ministers do, would be even happier if each and every person entered into the sung prayer with them. That active involvement would be thanks enough because that is what they strive for **most!** 

As a former parish music director myself, I know how much time and effort go into a good music ministry, like the one we have here at St. Mary. Perhaps, our support could be shown by a personal word of encouragement, or especially the promise of prayer. Prayer of thanksgiving to God for all the gifts/ talents he so generously bestows upon each of us; prayer of thanksgiving for the generous souls who give so much of themselves to draw us closer to the Lord: these would be most appropriate at the Eucharist.

In expressing that <u>prayerful</u> gratitude, let us not forget the priest/deacon (who works on preparing his homily throughout the week), the Eucharistic Ministers who take one or more hours out of their Sunday family time (and also during the week) to bring Communion to the sick; Lectors who reflect/prepare to proclaim God's Word to us; Altar Servers and their families who revise family schedules to serve faithfully at Mass; Ministers of Hospitality/Ushers who serve so diligently to make St. Mary the welcoming parish it is. All of these ministers work together to enable and enhance and support the <u>main lay ministry in the celebration</u> - the **ministry of the assembly** - that is, ALL OF US (the People of God) as together, we unite our hearts with the priest, in this supreme prayer of praise and thanksgiving to God. (Our full engagement in the Mass – singing and silence, speaking and contemplation – is our exercise in the priestly work of all the baptized.)

So, let us continue to hold each other in prayer and support each other in faith... but at the end of Mass, please "hold the applause". That way, all we do there may forever be Ad maiorem Dei gloriam ("To the Greater Glory of God").

#### A SENSE OF A GOOSE

Next fall, when you see geese heading south for the

winter, flying along in "V" formation, you might consider what science has discovered as to why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in "v" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71 percent greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going more quickly and easily, because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it aloneand quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front. If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those people who are headed the same way we are.

When the head goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point. It is sensible to take turns doing demanding jobs, whether with people or with geese flying south.

Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. What messages do we give when we honk from behind?

Finally-and this is important-when a goose gets sick or is wounded by gunshot, and falls out of formation, two other geese fall out with that goose and follow it down to lend help and protection. They stay with the fallen goose until it is able to fly or until it dies; and only then do they launch out on their own, or with another formation to catch up with their group. *If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by each other like that.*-Author Unknown
