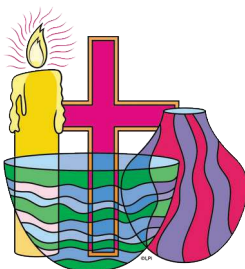

Recognizing God In Your Ordinary Moments

Many years ago, during faith formation in my parish, one of the children wrote something that wasn't very nice on a textbook that belonged to someone else. Being the pastoral associate that oversaw the program, I began the investigation immediately. Slowly I began eliminating suspects until it became obvious who the perpetrator was.

He denied he was the one, but after much pressure he broke down and confessed. Of course, I derived no satisfaction from finding out the culprit. Of course, it was my own son.

My son didn't want to come clean because he naturally feared what I would say and do when I found out. He also knew that our pastor would find out as well. He felt accountable for his actions and that made it very difficult for him. He realized he let himself, others that loved him, and God down. It was a lesson learned that wasn't much fun to go through. What I was grateful for was the fact that he felt the weight of what he had done. If he hadn't, things would have been very different.

That was a long time ago and when I reflect on it, I think about how often we all do things we regret and then have to face the consequences. But that's what being accountable is all about. We are accountable to those we love, to our neighbor, and to our God. When we begin to slide into a worldview that focuses too much on ourselves, we can easily make decisions that hurt others. We must always seek to do what is good in the eyes of God and that respects others. When we are children this is easier said than done. Alright, let's be honest--it isn't always so easy as adults either. -Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

They may do this during the celebration with a period of silence, with a hymn, psalm or other song of praise, or also after the celebration, if possible by staying behind to pray for a suitable time."^[3] Taken from Wikipedia

Pope Benedict XVI in *Sacramentum Caritatis* referred to the "precious time of thanksgiving after communion," urging everyone to preserve the importance of Communion as "a personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in the sacrament." (Taken from Wikipedia.)

From St. Faustina's Diary: "After Communion today, Jesus told me how much He desires to come to human hearts." **"I desire to unite Myself with human souls; My great delight is to unite Myself with souls. Know, My daughter, that when I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, My hands are full of all kinds of graces which I want to give to the soul."**

ST MARY "ALL SOULS" REMEMBRANCES

In November, St. Mary will remember all souls in following ways:

Special Remembrance Mass

This year's annual Remembrance Mass will be celebrated on Thursday, November 2nd, at 7:00pm. Parishioners who have died since last November 2nd, will automatically be included. *In addition, all parishioners are invited to contact the parish office and give us the names of any loved ones, from elsewhere, who have died this past year, too.* At that Mass, we will read aloud the names of all of these, and one family member will be able to place a flower in a vase before the altar as their loved one's name is read. *If you would like to include someone, please contact the parish office, as soon as possible.* (To be included on the poster of names that is in the Gathering Space throughout the month, **we must have the name no later than October 23rd** (but you can still be included in the flower remembrance at Mass, after that date). Please call/email the parish office, either way.



Parish Remembrance Book

Our Remembrance Book is in place in the Gathering Space. We invite you to list there the names of your deceased loved ones who died this year, whether from St. Mary, or not. Every person listed will be especially remembered in the intentions at all the Masses celebrated during the month of November, at St. Mary.

All Souls: General Intercessions

Those loved ones listed on our All Souls envelopes are traditionally remembered throughout the month, in our intentions. This will remain so. *However, additionally, beginning this year,* the names of those listed on these envelopes, will be read in the General Intercessions at each Mass, a few at a time. Due to large number of names we anticipate, we will not be able to tell you exactly which Mass your loved one's name will be said, but you will know that sometime in the month, at either a daily or Sunday Mass, their name will be said aloud in the General Intercessions.

Sacrament of Baptism: Celebrated any Sunday of the month at the 11:30am Mass during the Easter Season, and on the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm all year round. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

Visitation & Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

Marriage: Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date.

Funerals: The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation. 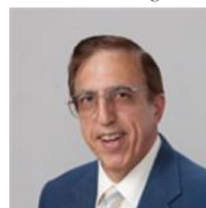
