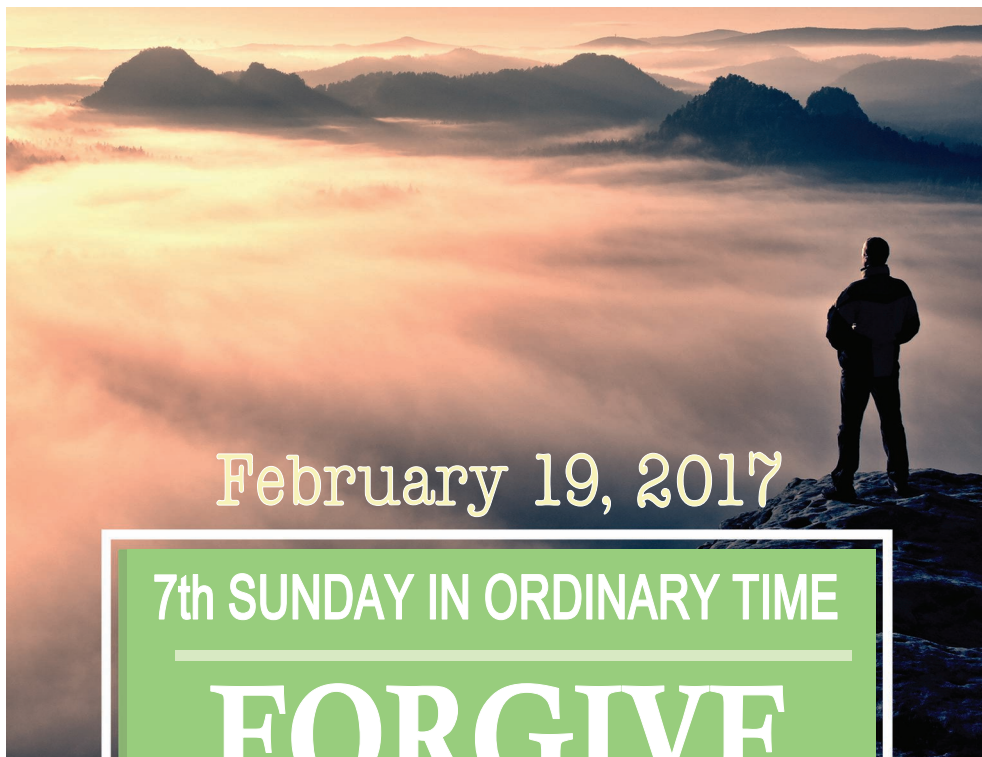

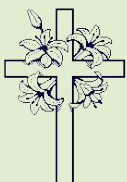

We Are All in this Together!

Dear Parishioners,

A baby's baptism is truly a time to rejoice as we welcome a new member to our family of faith... This year, we have further cause to celebrate. We have an adult catechumen (learner) with whom to celebrate the special preparatory rites of Baptism, this Lent. Jonathan Murray hopes to be fully initiated into the Catholic Faith at the Easter Vigil. So perhaps, this is good time for all of us to take a little time to reflect, not just on what is happening for him, but on how that touches all of us, and why...

Until about 50 years ago, if an adult wanted to become a Catholic, or a Catholic was baptized but never made their First Communion, or received Confirmation, they would attend "catechism" or "convert" classes. These classes were generally held one to one with a priest. When ready, the person was baptized quietly, even on weekdays, with just godparents in attendance. This important occasion in the life of the parish went completely unnoticed by the community. And, the person being baptized was generally unable to feel that he/she was becoming part of something beyond themselves.

*In the early Church, the **entire community of the faithful was involved** in the preparation of the Baptismal candidates (catechumens) –so much so that they were called upon to give testimony about the person's life and whether he/she had demonstrated a sincere intent to follow Christ as evident by their lifestyle.*

In that sense, the entire community sponsored the individual. If the candidate was deemed unready, Baptism was delayed for at least another year. For most people, the whole process of preparation took over 3 years. Baptism was definitely not taken lightly. It was certainly not a mere family tradition or milestone marker along the way of childhood, as it can often seem to some today. The thought of the entire community being impacted (having a stake, if you will) in this addition, really is not that different than our own families. When a member marries, or has a child, each family member is affected by that addition. Each one has a stake in helping that person become fully part of the family; in learning what it means to be a Smith, Jones, Doe, etc. As that new member learns from the family, he/she becomes a more fully integrated into it and an active part of it. He/she can more fully present themselves as a Smith, Jones, Doe, to the world, knowing now "from the inside, out" what that means.

*In the first centuries, Baptisms were celebrated only once a year. Immediately following Baptism, the individuals were confirmed. Then, they **completed** their initiation into the community **by being admitted to the Eucharistic table** for the first time. (Most Orthodox rites still do this, even with children.) This all took place during the supreme liturgy of the year, the Easter Vigil, during which, those who had been fully prepared (and approved by the community) were baptized by complete immersion. They left behind everything, including clothing, to enter the baptismal pool. Called by their new name, they were lowered three times, into the water completely (head to toe) to symbolize their dying to their old life/selves and rising to new life in Christ. They/we are a new creation, re-born in Christ. The baptismal font, itself is referred to as the "womb" of the church, for this very reason.*

As soon as they came out of the pool, they were clothed in a white garment as the outward sign of their newness – their new life/dignity in Christ. We still have this symbol today in the white garment we clothe our children in for Baptism. It has lost some of its impact since they arrive already wearing it. That is why a new white cloth or bib is later placed upon the child.

After the newly baptized emerged from the pool, they were led to another place in the church where the Bishop completed this process of baptism by anointing them with chrism thereby "sealing them with the Spirit".

For many reasons, and especially as the church grew, the Bishop could no longer be with the entire community at once. This anointing/sealing was delayed until the newly baptized could be anointed by him. It was this split in time, that led to this anointing becoming a separate sacrament in itself – which we know today as Confirmation, but the correct order of the sacraments, even then remained, Baptism, Confirmation, and then Eucharist. Relatively recently, (speaking in church history terms), in an effort to bring children to Christ in Holy Communion sooner, the order of the sacraments got shuffled, in the Roman Rite.

When Vatican II restored the R.C.I.A., the order was reclaimed and at the Easter Vigil, this year, (with the grace of God) Jonathan will be baptized, then confirmed and then admitted to the Eucharistic Table for the first time, thereby completing his initiation; experiencing/celebrating these sacraments in order. We, throughout Lent will be asked to corporately testify to his preparedness, & support him with our example & prayers.

It’s Rice Bowl Time!

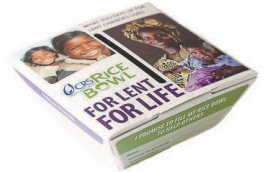
Once again, this Lent, we will have the opportunity to support Catholic Relief Services’ programs around the world and here at home.

PARISH INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism: Celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month at the 11:30am Mass, and on the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

Visitation & Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

Marriage: Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date.

Funerals: The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation. 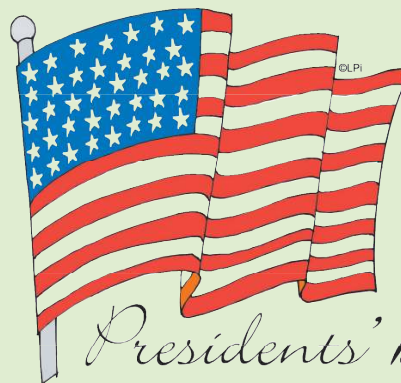
