Coming Full Circle

Dear Parishioners,

Having reflected on a deeper understanding of Baptism, let's see how our R.C.I.A. (Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults) process reflects all of the points we've considered.

Community Involvement: Rather than a one to one meeting with a priest, people inquiring into the Catholic Faith encounter the entire faith community. How? First, through an RCIA team of volunteers from our faith community who welcome the inquirers and begin to have weekly sessions with them wherein they teach the key components of our faith—and equally importantly, share their own faith journey. The inquirers then begin to open up and share their story and with the grace of God, come to faith.

Once the inquirer is ready, the team prepares them for their official “acceptance” by the faith community, eliciting also their prayers and support. This is done with the celebration at Sunday Mass of the first Rite, the “Rite of Acceptance and Welcome”. While often celebrated around the beginning of Advent, its timing is mainly based on the inquirer's readiness. Within this Rite, the inquirers officially become “catechumens” (learners). This begins the period of ongoing catechesis (teaching and faith-sharing) that will take place with the team and their sponsors/godparents right up to (and beyond) their Baptism. It also begins to incorporate them into the prayer life of the parish by bringing them to the Sunday Eucharist where they stay with us for the Liturgy of the Word. We, too, share the responsibility of “sponsor” to these men and women. After the homily, each Sunday, the presider prays a short dismissal prayer over them, sending them to reflect further upon the readings with the team members. Their dismissal also points to the special-ness of the day when they will remain with us to partake in the Eucharist.

Lent traces its very existence to the intense preparation period of the early catechumens for reception of the Easter sacraments. So, during Lent now, there are special “Rites” also that are celebrated each Sunday with the catechumens. As they, in Lent, prepare to make their Baptismal promises, we seek to more deeply live out our Baptismal commitment, examining our lives and preparing to renew our Baptismal promises, as well. The first Lenten Rite for our catechumens is the “Rite of Election”, celebrated with the Bishop. The parish has a sending forth ceremony on the First Sunday in which we pray over the catechumens and send them forth to the Bishop. This parallels the recommendation of the early faith community that these people are serious about their commitment to Christ. After that rite, the catechumens are now called the “elect” and have all the rights and privileges associated with the baptized members of the church, (e.g. Christian burial).

On the Second Sunday of Lent, there is a special penitential rite celebrated for baptized Christians who wish to become Catholics and for Catholics who are taking part in the RCIA to complete their initiation with the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. This is in preparation for their celebration of the Sacrament of Penance, renewing the forgiveness and membership in Christ's Body, given them at Baptism. On the remaining Sundays, we celebrate with the elect the “Scrutinies”. These are actually the beginning part of the Baptism ritual.

EASTER CONNECTION: The Easter Vigil liturgy remains the Supreme liturgy of the Church year. The Vigil has been and remains the preeminent place for full initiation into the Catholic Faith (the Easter Sacraments).

This connection is especially seen during the Triduum (the 3 day celebration of the Paschal Mystery: beginning Holy Thursday evening). Each year, oils are blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week and distributed to each parish. Oils blessed the year before are either burned or buried. Each year, we rise anew in our relationship with Christ. Each year, new oils (and baptismal water) and Paschal candle are blessed.

What are these oils? Why oil? From antiquity, oil has been seen as having medicinal/healing qualities as well as strengthening ones. Since antiquity, oil has been used to consecrate and “anoint” the head of one chosen for a particular office or mission. The oils blessed are the Oil of the Sick (used for the Anointing of the Sick), the oil of catechumens (used as the first anointing in the Baptism rite) and **CHRISM**.

Chrism is consecrated and tinged with a special perfume. (Just as perfume is designed to attract others, the perfume in sacred chrism is a sign of our call to attract others to Christ by our life).

“Use of chrism is reserved for the non-repeatable sacraments that confer a character (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders)... (it) is a sign that Christians, incorporated by baptism into the paschal mystery of Christ, dying, buried & rising with him, **are sharers in his kingly, prophetic priesthood** and that by confirmation they receive the spiritual anointing of the Spirit who is given to them” (“R.C.I.A. Study Edition, 1979).

Each of us has been anointed with Chrism at Baptism, and Confirmation. So, the R.C.I.A., is not just about those coming to Faith. It is an ongoing reminder to all of the “anointed”, that is - all of us. It reminds of who we **are**... and who we are **called to be** for others.

Lent calls us to take reflection time; time to deepen our relationship with Christ and each other in faith. As we begin our journey with Christ anew, this year, let us pray for Jonathan and each other, and all those one with us in Faith throughout the world. Then, I invite you especially to come to the Easter Vigil, and experience and witness the power of the Holy Spirit, present and working in God's People together with the Risen Christ present with us and within us, as we celebrate the Feast of our Salvation and welcome a new member of the family! Blessed Lent everyone!

Disciplines of Lent

The Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations are as follows: *Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on (Ash Wednesday) and all the Fridays of Lent. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on (Ash Wednesday) and Good Friday. On (Ash Wednesday) and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other smaller meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
