

3rd Sunday of Easter

Peter's fishing trip in this weekend's Gospel is not quite as involved as some trips that modern day fishermen might take. Since he was a fisherman by trade, he likely walked out of his house, grabbed a few of his buddies, and went out in the boat for the night hoping to make a good catch. While there was always preparation to be done (mending the nets, repairing the boat, etc.), from the Gospel story it seems that Peter's decision to go fishing was pretty spontaneous. It was near dawn when Jesus showed up and they caught a tremendous amount of fish.

Any avid fisherman is always ready to go out and

fish. Once you're out there, it could be just the right moment to pull in a lot of fish. Like a fisherman, we never quite know when the moment may come to "catch" someone for Christ. As Christians, we always have to be prepared to tell the story of who Jesus is , by word, and by living our lives as kind and loving people.

These types of witnesses can be a providential moment to attract others to the Lord.

What Is Eucharistic Adoration?

Of all the devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest, after the 7 Sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us... the Eucharist is a priceless treasure. By not only celebrating the Eucharist, but also by praying before it outside of Mass, we are enabled to make contact with the very wellsprings of Grace." St. Alphonsus Liguori

- **The Eucharist** is the TRUE or actual BODY, BLOOD, SOUL, and DIVINITY of Jesus Christ our Lord God and Savior. Body, Blood and Soul is the actual God created being. Divinity is the Holiness of God. **Adoration** is the honoring and praising of our Lord. During Eucharistic Adoration, God and Man are reaching out for each other, at the same time.
- **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** is to EXPOSE Jesus Christ's true body, blood, soul and divinity to us in person, 'face to face' so to speak. Although this face to face may be referred to as "we see Him through the veil of the Blessed Sacrament," Jesus is taken from a place of repose (resting place), the Tabernacle, and His Body is EXPOSED to us in a Monstrance. (Monstrance in Latin means To Expose). Because Jesus' Body is Exposed to us, it is called the EXPOSITION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT.
- Lord. Why Adoration? Jesus said, "Come to Me all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Are you feeling beaten down by life, misunderstood, have financial worries, unsuccessful projects, work issues, health issues, family issues, searching for love, or searching for solace from guilt of past sins? Then go to Jesus, spend time in His presence, and He will give you rest! The more time you spend with Jesus the more you will come away feeling renewed and healed.
 - What shall I do at Adoration? Talk to Jesus. This is the closest you will get to Him here on earth, besides receiving Him at Mass. Read the Bible. Read inspirational books. Sit in peace. Love the Lord. Pray the Rosary, pray for peace, pray for your friends and family, pray in thanksgiving for all the blessings that the Lord has given you, pray in thanksgiving simply because God chose you for this world, pray for forgiveness, pray to end abortion, pray for grace, pray for Jesus and the Holy Spirit to guide you through life. Time spent with our Lord Jesus Christ in Adoration can become one



of the most profound, meaningful, joyful, peaceful, and healing experiences we ever have here on earth!

SUMMER INTENSIVE RELIGIOUS ED PROGRAM

St. Mary is now offering the option of a Summer Intensive Religious Education Program. Classes for Levels 1-8, will run for 10 consecutive weekdays, from July 11th-22nd, from 9:00am to Noon. Sacrament of Baptism: Celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month at the 11:30am Mass, and on the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

Visitation & Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

Marriage: Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date. **Funerals:** The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. The Mass is the greatest

prayer of the Church. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): The RCIA is a process of

formation for full initiation of Adults (RCIA). The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation.
