THE HOLY EUCHARIST

Have you considered the miracle we have in the Eucharist? Before our very eyes, and in the depths of our hearts, Our Lord becomes truly and fully present. What an incredible gift! Every day, every Sunday, every holyday, we are all invited to this foretaste of heaven, as we come to the source of our life as Christians and are nourished and empowered to be Christ for all we meet. Our schedule of Masses is as follows. Please join us!

Daily Mass: Monday through Friday: 8:00 am (Chapel)

Weekend Masses: 5:00pm (Sat.), 8:00am, 10:00am, 11:30am Korean Mass: 5:00pm (Sunday)

Holy Days: 8:00am, 12:10pm, and 7:00pm

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

How are you living out your Baptismal vocation? In Marriage? Single life? Priesthood? Religious Life? All of these paths in life enable us to live out the call of Christ, given in Baptism, to bring his love, his peace, his mercy to the world. Through Baptism, we have been incorporated into the life of the Church; made living members of the Body of Christ in/for the world. What a joy it is to bring adults and children into this wondrous way of living. Baptisms are celebrated on the 1st Sunday (during the 11:30am Mass) and the 3rd Sunday (at 12:30pm), every month. THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

God's mercy is unfathomable! Sin ruptures not only our relationship with God, but also with our brothers and sisters. Yet, God's offer of forgiveness is renewed each and every day. Through the Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation), we encounter Christ, present in our midst, offering healing, forgiveness and renewed strength; reconciling us with Himself and each other. How long has it been for you? Our priests are here every Saturday at 8:30am & 10:00-10:30am. They would also be happy to meet with you, by appointment.

In Advent and Lent, we also have special Communal Penance Services, in union with the other parishes of Cherry Hill.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY MATRIMONY

Two truly become one, united in Christ Jesus forever, in the holy sacrament of Matrimony. When God is at the center of your love, blessings and strength abound. Our entire parish family rejoices when couples pledge themselves to each other, sanctifying their union within the celebration of the Eucharist. St. Mary offers couples, planning to marry, a preparation process which will aid them on their journey through life together. To make this preparation possible, we ask couples to contact us a year in advance of their wedding. (*If you would like to speak with a priest about the status of your marriage, please call the parish office anytime.)

DEVOTIONS AT ST. MARY

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

"Do you realize that Jesus is there in the tabernacle expressly for you-for you alone? He burns with the desire to come into your heart...Go, without fear to receive the Jesus of peace and love (St. Therese of Lisieux). Spend some quiet time with our Precious Lord. Mondays in the Chapel, 9:00am-1:15pm. Occasional holy hours and benediction are also offered, throughout the year.

THE HOLY ROSARY

Catholics are sometimes misunderstood in their devotion to Mary, our Blessed Mother. While all Christians pray to God, we as Catholics have a tradition of asking Mary to join her prayer to ours, in intercession. Our Rosary comes out of that tradition. We encourage you to pray the Rosary personally, and we invite you to pray the Rosary, here with us, every Thursday after 8:00am Mass, in the Chapel.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross began as the practice of pious pilgrims to Jerusalem who would retrace the final journey of Jesus Christ to Calvary. Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the Stations of the Cross currently found in almost every church.(-Adapted/Taken from:http://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/stations-of-the-cross/index.cfm)

RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVES
