Who among us has not known the need of a reassuring hand or hug, or word of comfort when a loved one dies. We each have experienced the strength and healing that comes from such an encounter.

Here at St. Mary, our bereavement ministers reach out to those in grief; to extend that consolation; to help them put the funeral Mass “pieces” (readings, music, ministers) in place.... And, when needed, to follow up with our parish’s extended support...

Presently, we have on 2 ministers who meet with the family when the call comes in that a parishioner has died. We have only 4 ministers able to alternately serve as Altar Servers, at the funeral Mass. And, only 1 who is able to do a follow-up phone call.

Would you consider becoming an instrument of Christ’s strength and consolation to those in need? Would you be willing to do any component of this Ministry? Training would be provided by those already serving.

Please consider this opportunity? St. Mary averages about 30 funerals a year... so we really do need additional ministers to care for those experiencing loss in our midst.

Be the comfort for others that others have been, at those times, for you.

DIOCESAN ANNOUNCEMENT: It has come to the attention of the Bishop's Office that Father Gustavo Agudelo, a priest of the Diocese of Barcelona in Venezuela, is presenting himself for ministry here in the Diocese of Camden. The faithful should know that Father Agudelo **does not** have to the faculties (the right) to celebrate Mass or the Sacraments in the parishes of the diocese and is not permitted to do so in private homes without the expressed written permission of the Bishop. Any questions regarding this matter are to be addressed to the Chancellor's Office of the Diocese of Camden.

PARISH INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism: Celebrated on the 1st Sunday of the month at the 11:30am Mass, and on the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

Visitation & Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

Marriage: Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date.

Funerals: The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation.
