

### **Recognizing God in Ordinary Moments** Here we are, mere days from Christmas, and we hear a Gospel anticipating the birth of another child. Mary has received word

that her cousin Elizabeth is with child. Pregnant as she is, Mary "set out and traveled to the hill country in haste." She has recently received the greatest news of her life - that she is to be mother to the Messiah by the power of the Holy Spirit - but her concern is for her cousin in need. Through God's grace, Elizabeth turns it into an opportunity to honor the coming Christ. "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Yet Mary's example of selflessness should inspire us.

As Christmas draws near, there is plenty of goodness to anticipate for many of us. We'll reunite with family and friends, uphold time-honored traditions, swap stories old and new, exchange gifts, and welcome Jesus at the Christmas liturgy. These are wonderful things! Of course, they probably all come with their own to-do list. Shop for last-minute gifts, pick up recipe ingredients, ready the guest room, or pack your own bags. Mary probably had things to do as well.

She had a lot to consider, for one thing. How do you plan to tell your parents you're pregnant, but no man was involved? When Joseph finds out, who will care for the practical needs of you and your child? Into what may have been a chaos of questions, Mary receives news that someone is in need. She goes immediately.

In these final days before Christmas, stay watchful and awake! You never know when God might invite you to welcome, hospitality, and compassion. It might be tempting to reject the opportunity for your own needs. Follow the example of Mary! If God is providing you an opportunity to love, He will provide the means to accomplish all your other tasks. # Pat Galie's Religious Education News As a member of the "Soldier's Angels" organization for over 10 years, I have participated in the "Adopt a Soldier" program. The organization

gives me the name and Army Post Office address of a soldier serving overseas. Religious Education students in Grades 7 and 8 take turns packing a CARE package with suggested items and hand-written letter as part of their Global Service requirement for Confirmation. I complete the customs form and take the Priority Mail box to the Post Office using the student's postage money. Sean Murphy sent the first CARE package to our adopted airman, James, who is stationed on a small base with limited resources. Below is the correspondence I received. What a coincidence that James is Catholic and a catechist, who uses "Decision Point" for Confirmation like we do!

Thank you for your kind words and support! As the commander of my small unit, my job is to make sure my Airmen (and women) have the adequate training, supplies, and equipment to accomplish the mission. 

### **Parish Pastoral Council Elections**

### Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)

The Parish Pastoral Council serves as the ordinary planning body that St. Mary Church uses to formulate its pastoral plan. Informed by the diocesan Vision Statement and by the parish's Mission Statement, Father Paul consults the Council about any practical matters such as the implementation of local pastoral priorities which will in many cases resonate with the diocesan pastoral priorities which are Liturgy, Lay Ministry, Lifelong Faith Formation, Priestly vocations, Youth and Young Adults, and Compassionate Outreach.

The St. Mary PPC is currently comprised of 13 members, excluding the pastor. Its main functions are to advise the pastor on developing and re-evaluating the parish mission statement, on initiating new parish programs, on evaluating the progress of existing parish programs, and in fostering pastoral activity within the parish. The PPC meets every other month and some of its members also serve on one of St. Mary many ministries.

### Ideal (or Expected) Qualities of Effective PPC Candidates/Members

The St. Mary PPC is currently comprised of 13 members, Ideal PPC candidates are expected to:

Be a Catholic in good standing

Engage in regular personal prayer

Worship with the parish community at Sunday Eucharist as often as possible

Have or want to be involved in the life of the parish

Think broadly, strategically and without bias

Possess a mind and heart open for the greater good of people, fellow parishioners, the church and community Other points?

### **PPC Member Election**

The St. Mary PPC Election is an open voting-based election in which candidates' profiles and statements are made public. Active parishioners will vote on the candidates and elect new PPC members. The current election will elect seven PPC members who will serve a two-year term. The timeline is as follows:

**December 16:** Candidate Nomination Period Opens **January 6:** Candidate Nomination Period Closes

January 13: Balloting Opens Balloting Closes

January 24: PPC ratifies election results
January 31: Election Results Announced

**Sacrament of Baptism:** Celebrated the 3rd Sunday at 12:30pm all year round. During the Easter season, Baptisms may be celebrated any Sunday during the 11:30am Mass. Parents are required to attend a preparatory session. Please make arrangements through the Parish Office.

**Visitation & Anointing of the Sick:** Please call the Parish Office if you or a family member is seriously ill, facing/recovering from surgery and would like to see a priest or receive the Anointing of the Sick. Holy Communion is also available to those who are homebound.

**Marriage:** Couples planning to marry will attend a marriage preparation program. Please contact the Parish Office one year in advance of the wedding date

**Funerals:** The proper form of burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial. The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church. Your Funeral Director will assist you by making the necessary arrangements with St. Mary.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA):** The RCIA is a process of formation for full initiation into the Catholic Church. It is open to those never baptized, those baptized in another faith, and Catholics who have not received First Communion and Confirmation. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

**Liturgy Committee:** Anyone interested in learning more about our Sacred Liturgy is invited to attend the meeting. Please watch the bulletin for details.

**Finance Council:** The Finance council meets throughout the year and on an "as needed" basis, to assist the Pastor in the temporal needs of the Parish. Besides generating a yearly working budget, it offers the Pastor recommendations in ways of maintaining the temporal goods of the parish. As a matter of transparency, it also presents parishioners with periodic statements to ensure its financial stability

**Parish Pastoral Council:** This council, composed of elected & appointed parishioners, meets throughout the year as an advisory board to the Pastor. Its main purpose is to address pastoral needs, implement plans, & evaluate pastoral possibilities.
