




This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to his passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is the love he has for us


daily in the celebration of the Mass on altars in every church, in every city, in every nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask for more. This is the true heart of Christian stewardship.

Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 8, 2018

Whether statues or stained glass, the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus can be found in churches all over the world. Jesus looks down. one hand extended out and another pointing to a heart wreathed in thorns and glowing with light. In the Sacred Heart, we see both the sorrow and the joy of the life of Christ, who became one of us out of love. "Jesus knew and loved us each and all during his life, his agony, and his Passion and gave himself up for each one of us. He has loved us all with a human heart" (CCC 478). In the Incarnation, God becomes man. Jesus experienced the fullness of humanity, including its sufferings. June 8th is the Feast of the Sacred Heart. We remember all that Jesus endured for us. We also remember why he endured it -- out of love.

Immaculate Heart of Mary Saturday, June 9, 2018

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a devotional name used to refer to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her

compassionate love for all people. Traditionally, the heart is depicted pierced with seven wounds or swords, in homage to the seven dolors of Mary. Also, roses or another type of flower may be wrapped around the heart.

custom, tied to a passage from
the Gospel of Luke that speaks
of Mary's heart, "(and a sword
will pierce through your own
soul also), that thoughts out of
many hearts may be

revealed" (Luke 2:35).

CAMPAIGN FOR THE CATHOLIC COMMUNITY OF SOUTH JERSEY

LEADERSHIP WEEKEND WILL BE NEXT WEEKEND HELD ON JUNE 9th & 10th

During all Masses next weekend, we will invite all families who have not yet been contacted to join us in participating in the **Catholic Strong** campaign. We ask you to consider a sacrificial gift to the campaign – one that is right for you.

70% of funds remain at OUR parish!

Bishop Sullivan has asked each of us to consider a small amount each month over a three-to-five year period. Pledging allows each of us the opportunity to make a sacrificial gift that will help to shape the Church we leave for future generations of Catholic families in our community. The suggested giving plans listed below are an example of how a pledge can have a profound impact on our parish and programs across our diocese.

Our Parish Goal is \$800,000. We will utilize the 70% to address the following needs:

• Replace Parish Hall & Church HVAC/air conditioning system (\$200,000) • Renovate Parish Hall kitchen

(\$50,000) • Reupholster Church pews and remove carpeting to replace with tile (\$140,000) • Replace rectory roof (\$15,000) • Replace roof on Parish Hall (\$90,000) • Hire a full-time Youth/Young Adult & Family minister and provide funding for one year of salary and benefits (\$65,000) - Replace Church Sound System (\$20,000)

Thirty percent (30%) aids enhanced evangelization and new ministries in South Jersey:

- Strong faith and evangelization programs
- Strong service ministries in the forms of addiction healing, legal counsel, and assistance to marginalized individuals and families; and finally
- Strong Catholic schools by providing scholarship assistance, professional development, challenging programming, and a strong central office.

Possible Gift Plans (36 months)

\$208 per month over 36 months = \$7,500 \$167 per month over 36 months = \$6,000 \$84 per month over 36 months = \$3,000 \$50 per month over 36 months = \$1,800

Possible Gift Plans (60 months)

\$334 per month over 60 months = \$20,000 \$250 per month over 60 months = \$15,000 \$167 per month over 60 months = \$10,000 \$100 per month over 60 months = \$6,000
